Heartland Welsh Back-to-Back Gold Shows August 18-21, 2011

All ponies and cobs (both Welsh and Half Welsh), in order to be eligible for any class or division in this show, must be registered in the stud book of the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc., or the Welsh Section of the Canadian Pony Society and must be entered under their full registered name, or in the case of a foal, be eligible for registration. All ponies and cobs except foals MUST have a copy of their certificate of registration from the Welsh pony and Cob Society of America or Canada with their entry forms. **Entries that DO NOT have a copy of their registration papers included will be considered post-entries.** All ponies and cobs traveling to our show from out of state, must include a current (within one year of the show) **NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST CERTIFICATE** or copy thereof with their entries.

WPCSA Measurement Rules

All Welsh ponies and Cobs, 6 years and older, showing in breed classes and all Welsh and Half Welsh ponies showing in WPCSA Performance classes must be measured or present a valid USEF measurement card, a permanent WPCSA card or 2 temporary WPCSA cards. Measurement for non-WPCSA members is \$5.00 per measurement.

Measurement of Welsh Ponies and Cobs will take place:

6 to 8 pm Wednesday, August 17
7 to 9 am Thursday through Sunday

Schooling times for Hunter course:

The hunter classes will be on Thursday and Sunday, so the course will be open for schooling those mornings. We will reserve the last 15 minutes before starting hunter classes for the short stirrup riders.

No schooling is permitted on the trail course

Rules and Regulations

Entries are made by exhibitors with the understanding that they are familiar with the following:

1. Junior exhibitors must wear approved protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times while on the show ground. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.
2. No exhibitor will be allowed to receive their numbers until all fees are paid and a negative Coggins test (for out of state ponies & cobs) is delivered.
2. All entry blanks must be completed and signed.
3. There can be no substitution of ponies. Names and registration numbers of ponies must be given.
4. The Judges' Decision is final.
5. The Committee, The Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America, Inc., the Heartland Welsh Club, or the Hoosier Horse Park, will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to any rider, groom, attendant, animal or equipment at the show. The management is not liable for injury to person or pony at any time, which includes going to and coming from, and in the ring. Neither will it be responsible for vehicles, or any article that may be lost or damaged. All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them or their agents to tents and other properties on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly.
6. The Judge and the Show Committee may intercede in any situation that appears to be unsafe to exhibitors, ponies and bystanders to reduce the possibility of accident or injury.
7. Entries are a firm commitment to attend the show.
8. Every class offered herein including is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current WPCSA Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
9. All ponies must be serviceably sound. In case of suspected unsoundness the judge may, if they so desire, have the animal examined by a Veterinarian provided by the committee and his decision will be final. No exhibitor may use a Veterinarian statement to contradict the judge's decision.
10. No Fees will be refunded for entries made and not shown unless the class is canceled or if a Veterinarian certificate is presented prior to the start of the show.
11. The committee reserves the right to decline any entry and return any entry fee and/or stabling fee before or during the show without being liable for compensation.
12. All attendants coming in charge of ponies will be subject to the order of the Executive Committee and must have their ponies ready to enter the Show Ring at least a quarter of an hour before the time for showing them.
13. No person will be allowed in the Show Ring during the time of judging except the entry or entries and those having duties to perform.

14. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judge or officials, on the part of the owner, rider, or groom, shall disqualify the ponies, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.
15. The Committee reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a pony in the ring and to remove any groom or pony from the show without being liable for compensation.
16. Should any question or dispute arise that is not provided for in the foregoing rules, the same shall be submitted to the Show Rules Committee/Technical Delegate whose decision will be final.
17. Ponies arriving on the grounds prior to 12:00 p.m. Wednesday, August 17 or staying after 11:00 p.m. Sunday, August 21 **MUST** make special arrangements with the show secretary.
18. All Welsh ponies 6 years & over, showing in breeding classes and all Welsh & Half Welsh showing in WPCSA Performance classes must be measured or present a valid USEF or WPCSA measurement card.
20. A Junior exhibitor is an individual who has not reached his/her 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year. The age of an individual on December 1st will be retained throughout the entire competition year. Persons born on December 1st assume the greater age on that date.
21. An adult exhibitor is an individual who has reached his/her 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year.
22. \$400.00 guaranteed prize money PER SHOW for WPCSA classes. There will be payback to Half-Welsh Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion winners, Breed Supreme and Gelding Supreme of \$10.00 for Champion, \$5.00 Reserve, per judge. There will be a payback to Performance Division Stakes Classes and Carriage Driving Obstacles/Cones (#3 & #194) winners of \$10.00 to first place and \$5.00 to 2nd place. All classes must have 3 or more entries shown and judged for monies to be paid.
23. Performance points will be awarded to the pony with the highest cumulative point total from all three classes within the division. Points are awarded as follows: 1st place - 5 points; 2nd place - 3 points; 3rd place - 2 points; 4th place - 1 point.
24. Ribbons will be given for 1st through 4th places in all classes. Ribbons will be given for all Champion and Reserve in Halter and in Performance divisions. Ribbons given to ALL leadline participants. Prize money will be mailed within 45 days of the close of the show.
25. Dogs on the show ground **MUST** be kept on a leash.
26. Wire-wheeled vehicles are permitted in all driving classes.
27. Refunds of entry fees will not be given in the event a class or classes, or all or part of the competition is cancelled due to storm, accident or other emergency.
28. E-mail (jens@heartlandwelsh.org) or faxed (1-888-263-6997) entries will be accepted, but at the post entry rate unless a check is mailed to the show secretary and postmarked by the closing date.
29. Any class can be split by show management at their discretion.
30. **Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched, anywhere on the show grounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.**

Extraordinary Show Rule Change Effective Immediately: "A properly attired groom or passenger is required for all pairs, tandems, unicorns or 4 in hand, capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class."

WPCSA Rules and Class Descriptions

Breed Classes

(Article 110.2) Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

Performance Classes

WPCSA Welsh Carriage Driving Division

(Article 113.2 (**wire wheeled vehicles can be used if stated in prize list.**) Classes open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. In addition to the gaits detailed in the pleasure driving section (Article 113.1.11) (walk, working trot, strong trot, halt and rein back). Carriage driving also requires the slow trot where the animal should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. Turnout to be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners and way of going. Working class to be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire. Obstacle/Cones to be judged 100% on performance. Refer to specifications in rulebook for the type of obstacle/cones classes being offered.

WPCSA Obstacle - Pick Your Route

1. To be driven over a course of obstacles (paired markers) with no set route. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles.
2. Typically obstacles in this type of class are not measured for each entry, but are set at 2.5 meters or 8'3" at the start of the competition, and only reset in the event of a knockdown.
3. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated finish line, choosing his own route. Each obstacle is to be negotiated once and only once, but may be approached from either direction.
4. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off (unless otherwise stated in the prize list).
5. Penalties (as they differ from those under penalties section):
 - a)Knocking down or dislodging obstacle 5 seconds
 - b)Driving through an obstacle again 10 seconds each time
 - c)Missing an obstacle Elimination

WPCSA Roadster Division

(Article 113.4 For Section A and B ponies 12.2 and under. Roadster must enter the ring clockwise at a jog-trot then show at the Road Gait; turn counter clockwise at the jog-trot, show at the Road Gait and then trot at speed. Must stand well while being judged in the line up. In the event of a workoff, entries chosen must work both ways of the ring, as the original routine. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, style and speed in form; 25% on breed type. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA Welsh Pleasure Driving Division

(Article 113.1) To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily**. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA Fine Harness Division

(Article 113.5) To be shown at a free animated park trot and an animated walk, extreme speed to be penalized. To stand quietly and back readily. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style, 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA Ridden Welsh Classic Sec. A & B

(Article 115.8) This class is for registered Welsh Ponies, Section A & B, 4 year of age and over. To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on performance. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot, and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation judging, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Class is an English class only. No Western, Saddle Seat or Side Saddle tack or attire. Qualified UK or American Judge to officiate.

Ridden Pony Welsh Classic 19, 210

WPCSA Ridden Welsh Classic Sec. C & D

(Article 115.7) This class is for registered Welsh Cobs and Welsh Ponies of Cob Type 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on performance. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. To be shown on both reins as a group at the walk, trot, and canter with animation. The required individual performance must show all four gaits (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped and judged for conformation judging, showing at the walk and trot, in hand, by the rider. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it may be retacked. Class is an English class only. No Western, Saddle Seat or Side Saddle tack or attire. Qualified UK or American Judge to officiate.

Ridden Cob Welsh Classic 20, 211

WPCSA Ridden Welsh Classic Championship

(Article 115.9) To be judged 50% on conformation and 50% on ridden performance. Open to first and second place winners from the Ridden Welsh A/B Classic and the Ridden Welsh C/D Classic. There is no entry fee for this class. Places will be awarded for the Best Ridden and the Reserve Best Ridden. Any animal in this class is eligible to be named the Best Ridden. Entries shall enter the arena at the walk in a clockwise direction. The Judge shall request all four gaits (walk, trot, canter, gallop) in at least one direction, but animals need not show in both directions. The judge shall consider the size of the ponies/cobs, ages of riders, safety of arena when determining whether to have the animals perform as a group or individually. Individual pattern is optional at the judge's discretion. Entries shall not be stripped as conformation score from the qualifying class shall be carried forward.

WPCSA English Pleasure Division

(Article 112.3) To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without a martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25 % on breed type and conformation. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA Short Stirrup Hunter

(Article 112.6) Division is open to riders 12 years and under. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. **RIDERS** in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. May either trot or canter the entire course. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under-saddle class, animal must have shown in **and completed** an over-fences class. Under-saddle class animals will be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter.

Short Stirrup 35, 36, 37, 226, 227, 228

WPCSA Short Stirrup Equitation

(Article 114.1) Division is open to riders 12 years & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. To be judged 100% on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount. Over Fences (o/f): Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Animals may either trot or canter the entire course. The o/f class must precede the under saddle class. Under saddle (u/s): Animals must walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **RIDERS** entering these classes, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup Hunter.

Short Stirrup Equitation 38, 39, 229, 230

WPCSA Long Stirrup Hunter

(Article 112.7) Classes are open to all ponies/cobs and Half-Welsh. **RIDERS** in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division at that show where the fences exceed 18". There are not restrictions for animals exhibiting in these classes. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences and 8 jumping efforts required. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. May trot or canter the entire course.

Long Stirrup Hunter (13-Adult)..... 40, 41, 42, 231, 232, 233

WPCSA Low Hunter

(Article 112.8) Division is open to ponies/cobs and half-Welsh, Juniors and Adults. These **ANIMALS** may not compete in any other over fences division at that show where fence heights exceed 18". There are no restrictions on the rider. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle classes. To be judged 100% on performance. May either trot or canter the entire course.

Low Hunter..... 43, 44, 45, 234, 235, 236

WPCSA Hunter

(Article 112.5) To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'.0"; animals exceeding 13.2 shall jump 2'6". Over fences (o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of **six** fences with eight jumping efforts of the required height. Under saddle (u/s): To be eligible, pony must have shown in and completed an over fence class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **May be required to hand gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.**

Over fences classes will be run on an open card. All ponies not exceeding 13.2hh will jump all of their courses before the over 13.2hh ponies jump their courses. Under saddle class will run after the last round of that division has been completed. If you need further explanation, please contact Jen Sommer before the show or talk to the ladies at the entry booth for details.

WPCSA Hunter Seat Equitation

(Article 114.3) Classes open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. To be judged on the rider's appearance, seat, hands and control of their mount. Animals 13.2 and under jump 2'; animals over 13.2 jump 2'6". Over Fence (o/f) classes: to be shown over a minimum of six obstacles. Under saddle (u/s) classes: to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Test may be required.

WPCSA Junior Handler

(Article 115.6) Judged on the ability and skill of the Junior in handling their pony/cob/half-Welsh as in the breed ring. The show qualities of the pony/cob/half-Welsh shall not be considered, although cleanliness and grooming can be considered. Exhibitors enter to the left so as not to obscure the judge's view. The judge evaluates the ability of the junior to follow directions, use space wisely, and execute the requested patterns. Juniors should appear "ring wise", be alert to the judging progression and be prepared for changes in the judging routine.

WPCSA Leadline Walk

(Article 115.4) Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk-trot, and leadline walk-trot poles.

Leadline Walk 64, 129

WPCSA Leadline Walk-Trot

(Article 115.4) Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot/jog. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk and leadline walk-trot poles.

Leadline Walk-Trot..... 65, 130

WPCSA Leadline Walk-Trot Poles

(Article 115.4) Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. Poles are to be placed at a minimum of 4 feet off the rail, two on each side of the ring, simulating a hunter course. The poles should be placed far enough away from the entrance gate to provide an adequate sized area to do an opening and closing circle. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk and leadline walk-trot .

Leadline Walk-Trot Poles 66, 131

WPCSA Welsh Pony Leading Rein

(Article 115.1) Section A, B, C or half-Welsh, mare or gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but not more than eight, years of age. **Ponies to be judged** on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turn-out. This is not an equitation class. **There are no restrictions for the pony or rider.**

Welsh Pony Leading Rein 4-8..... 67, 132

WPCSA Walk

(Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot and walk-trot poles. To walk both ways of the ring.

WPCSA Walk-Trot

(Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible test to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot poles.

WPCSA Walk-Trot Poles

(Article 115.5) Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. Poles are to be placed at a minimum of 4 feet off the rail, two on each side of the ring, simulating a hunter course. The poles should be placed far enough away from the entrance gate to provide an adequate sized area to do an opening and closing circle. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot.

WPCSA Welsh Child's First Pony
